Further to the acquisition of Rendel in the United Kingdom earlier this year, we can confirm that their integration and the synergies developed with the group are according to expectations. As a first significant joint contract, INGEROP in joint venture with Rendel has been awarded the design of the access roads to Tema port in Ghana. The group is active in Africa since the 70s and decided to invest in a company in South Africa as early as 1995. The proposed project would involve construction of a 37 km of rail line from Abidjan's international airport in the south of the city through the city center to its northern suburbs, hence transporting an estimated 300,000 passengers a day.

In May 2015, INGEROP, as leader of a consortium, was awarded by the European Union on behalf of the Government of Kenya, the feasibility study and detailed design of the Bus Rapid Transit system in terms of technical, economic, environmental, social, legal, institutional and operational issues on two corridors.

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GABON

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National Lopé Park
