THE ÉTAMINE CONSORTIUM WINS TWO MAJOR CONTRACTS AS PART OF THE EXTRAMOBILE PROGRAMME FOR THE EUROPEAN METROPOLIS OF LILLE

The European Metropolis of Lille has awarded the Étamine consortium, comprising SYSTRA, Ingérop, Transitec, Gautier+Conquet puma, Richez_Associés and Lavigne & Chéron, the project management of the new tramway for the Lille metropolitan area and its suburbs, as well as the Lille-Villeneuve d'Ascq Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) line.

The Extramobile programme, which aims to transform mobility in the European Metropolis of Lille (MEL) by 2035, consists of new, high-performance structural lines designed to improve accessibility and encourage a modal shift towards public transport.

The Étamine consortium has won two project management contracts for this programme:

- The Lille metropolitan area tramway and its surrounding area, awarded to the ÉTAMINE consortium, comprising SYSTRA (lead contractor), Ingérop, Transitec, and the architectural firms Gautier+Conquet puma, Richez_Associés and Lavigne & Chéron;
- The Lille Villeneuve d'Ascq BRT, awarded to the ÉTAMINE consortium, comprising SYSTRA, Ingérop (lead contractor), Transitec, and the architectural firms Gautier+Conquet puma and Richez_Associés.

A tramway and BRT line serving 290,000 residents

The tram line in the Lille metropolitan area and its suburbs aims to transform mobility, better connect the municipalities of the metropolis and improve the living environment of the Lille metropolitan area. With a route length of 25 km, it will criss-cross dense urban neighbourhoods as well as areas with high potential for development and urban planning, with around 47 stations located in 11 municipalities: Wambrechies, Marquette-Lez-Lille, Saint-André-Lez-Lille, Lambersart, La Madeleine, Lille, Loos, Haubourdin, Faches-Thumesnil, Wattignies and Templemars. The neighbourhoods served are home to approximately 180,000 residents and 136,000 jobs, and welcome up to 36,000 schoolchildren and students within a 500-metre radius of the line.

The Lille - Villeneuve d'Ascq BRT will connect the municipalities of Lomme, Lille, Hellemmes, Lezennes, Villeneuve d'Ascq and Sainghin-en-Mélantois, and even Loos and Sequedin, via approximately 36 stations, and will connect with the metro, tram and bus networks. It will serve nearly 112,000 residents and 136,000 jobs, while offering new connections to metropolitan facilities such as EuraTechnologies, the Stade Pierre



Mauroy, the Cité Scientifique campus in Villeneuve d'Ascq, and the Haute Borne Science Park, all of which are located with .

The aim of these projects is to support urban transformation and improve the living environment, while striving for environmental and societal excellence through an eco-design approach.

As part of the Extramobile programme, SYSTRA was also awarded the project management contract for the Maintenance and Storage Site (SMR) for the maintenance and storage of future tram trains in Lille and its suburbs, as well as the Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) project management contract for the transport systems required for all new tram and BRT line projects.
