



# Ingerop reports a turnover exceeding 500 million euros in 2025

With a fifth consecutive year of double-digit growth, Ingerop confirms its momentum and strengthens its position among leading engineering players in France and internationally.

**Rueil-Malmaison, France, May 26, 2026** – Ingerop, a leading engineering group supporting the ecological, energy, industrial and societal transitions, has announced its results for the 2025 financial year.

## **Sustained growth in France and internationally**

In 2025, Ingerop generated consolidated revenue of €507 million, up 11% compared with 2024. Activity remains primarily in France, accounting for more than two-thirds of total revenue.

Internationally, revenue has exceeded 31% for the past three years, driven by Germany (10% of revenue), the United Kingdom (5%), South Africa (2.5%), Australia (2%) and Spain (2%).

Operating income remains stable at around 5% of revenue.

At the end of March 2026, the order backlog stood at €777 million, representing 17 months of activity.

Yves Metz, Chairman of the Ingerop Group, emphasizes: *“This steady growth confirms our ability to support our clients on major projects, both in France and internationally. It reflects the strength of our model and supports our development prospects.”*

## **A development strategy supported by acquisitions and new locations**

2025 was marked by several external growth operations internationally, with acquisitions in the United Kingdom, Germany and Spain.

Ingerop also opened a subsidiary in Estonia to support Rail Baltica projects—a railway program linking the Baltic States to the European network—and in Albania at the beginning of 2026 for a high-level bus service project involving three lines in Tirana.

In France, Ingerop continued to expand its regional footprint with new offices in Cherbourg, Brest and Saint-Dizier, as well as an acquisition in Réunion Island.

*“Our development is based on a strong regional presence in France, complemented by a continuously expanding international footprint to support our clients as closely as possible to their challenges,”* explains Yves Metz.



## Projects supporting major transitions

Ingerop is involved in projects covering key energy, industrial and urban transitions.

Among the projects won in France are: an energy recovery facility near Toulouse for Suez; a cathode materials plant project in Dunkirk for the Orano Group, a key player in decarbonization and the battery sector; services for EDF's future EPR2 reactors in Gravelines and Bugey; a framework agreement for high-level bus services in Annecy; the extension of tram line T1 to Rueil-Malmaison; the Lyon rail bypass for SNCF Réseau.

Internationally, several major projects were also secured, including: a drinking water supply project for the upper uMkhomazi River basin in South Africa; an infrastructure package for Rail Baltica in Estonia, as well as power supply and overhead lines across the three Baltic countries; the immersed tunnel under the Fraser River in Vancouver, Canada; a desalination plant in Aqaba, Jordan for Suez; the sustainable refurbishment of the "Kennedy K45 and K47" buildings on the Kirchberg plateau in Luxembourg, with architecture firm BFF; infrastructure and systems integration for the Alexandria tramway in Egypt.

## Continuous workforce growth to support the Group's expansion

The Ingerop Group had 3,700 employees in the first quarter of 2026, compared with 3,300 at the end of 2024. Women represent 36% of total staff.

In France, 340 new employees joined during the year: recent graduates as well as experienced and senior professionals. Women accounted for 42% of these hires. Over the past four years, more than 1,400 recruitments have been carried out, bringing the workforce to approximately 2,500 employees.

At the same time, the Group welcomes many young talents each year: up to 180 interns depending on the period and 70 apprentices.

Internationally, the workforce represents 1,200 employees (+10% between 2024 and 2025) and has doubled since 2021.

## A new financial year approached with caution but confidence

For its new financial year, Ingerop expects organic growth of around 6%, with profitability levels similar to those of 2025.

Yves Metz concludes: *"The outlook for 2026–2027 remains positive. Major environmental and energy transitions, the development of public transport, and the needs of industry, defense, nuclear and energy infrastructure continue to support our business. In a context marked by certain tensions in order intake, we remain cautious but confident in our strategic choices. We will also continue recruiting across all our*



*business lines throughout France and worldwide to support our growth and mobilize the skills required to deliver the projects entrusted to us.”*
